

# Divine Deliverance of the Seed

1) Genesis 6:14-22 Noah prepared the Ark

Flood, Ark to preserve human life to preserve the Seed of the Woman. (Genesis 3:15)

2) Genesis 41:47-49 Joseph prepared the Storehouse

Famine, Storehouse to preserve human life. (The Seed)

3) Acts 7:17-36 ; Heb 11:23-29 God prepared The Man of God

Moses is The Man of God (Deuteronomy 33:1 ; Joshua 14:6 ;

Ezra 3:2 ; Psalm 90:1-17). The Man of God is an honourable

title, given to the servants of God. Moses to be used as the

deliverer of the Seed of the Woman.

# The Book of Exodus - Structural Outline, Themes and Subjects

“Exodus” means to “bring out”, as stated by Joseph in **Genesis 50:24**

The Book of Exodus has 3 main subdivisions and themes as laid out here.

## 1) Exodus 1:-18 Liberation (Freedom)

The main emphasis here is on the **Hand of God**.

**Exodus 3:20 ; 6:1 ; 7:4-5 ; 9:3 ; 13:3,9,14,16**

## 2) Exodus 19-24 Separation (Distinction)

The main emphasis here is the **Holiness of God**.

## 3) Exodus 25-40 Habitation (Reside)

The main emphasis here is on the **House of God (Sanctuary - Tabernacle)**. God had walked with His people (Adam, Enoch and Noah) in the Book of Genesis. Now, God wants to dwell with His people.

Today, God’s people (His saints) are His temple, His habitation, or His dwelling place. **1 Corinthians 6:19-20 ; Ephesians 2:19-22**

# Exodus 1:1-22, Keypoints as Regards to Israel as a Nation in Egypt

## 1) Exodus 1:1-8 The Nation Growing

Abraham's seed would become innumerable. Genesis 13:16 ; 15:4 ; 22:17

## 2) Exodus 1:9-22 The Nation Groaning

Enslavement, Affliction, Genocide. Abraham would become slaves under the new pharaohs due to hard labour and hardships.

### A) Exodus 1:9-14 Enslavement of Israel.

Israel is a slave to the nation of Egypt, building cities for Pharaoh in harsh labour

### B) Exodus 1:15-22 Genocide of Hebrew New-born Male

Pharaoh ordered midwives for all newly born Hebrew male children to be killed, and all newly born Hebrew female to remain alive.

#### i) Exodus 1:16-22 ; 2:10 Moses's Life was threatened from birth

Moses's Life was in danger from the Pharaoh's same decree, but God preserved Moses's Life.

#### ii) Exodus 2:15 Moses's Life was threatened by Pharaoh as an adult

Moses is threatened again, by Pharaoh, but flees the land of Egypt by the age of 40.

# Exodus 2:1-25, Moses is born

## 1) Exodus 2:1-4 The Birth of Moses

Moses's life was endangered by Pharaoh's decree. Moses's parents built an "ark" similar to a small floating basket, made from Bulrushes, slime and pitch. They placed Moses into the "ark" (basket), which was released into the river Nile.

As God preserved Noah in the Ark through the waters of the flood, God preserved Moses in a small "ark" (basket) through the waters of the river Nile.

## 2) Exodus 2:5-10 The Preservation of Moses

Pharaoh's daughter found Moses in the Ark, and adopted him as her own son. It was when Moses wept that touched the compassion of a Mother's heart. (Exodus 2:6) Miriam suggested to Pharaoh's daughter to call a Hebrew midwife. Miriam calls Moses's mother to care for Moses. Moses is returned to Moses's mother.

(Unbeknown to Pharaoh and Pharaoh's daughter, both did not know Miriam is Moses's sister, and the midwife is Moses's mother)

**Romans 8:28** "... All things work together for good ..." can be applied here. The providence is seen in all the small circumstances.

# Exodus 2:1-25, Moses is born

## 3) Exodus 2:11-15 **The Rejection of Moses**

**Acts 7:22 ; Hebrews 11:24-26.** Resulting in Moses to flee to Midian and his departure from the land of Egypt.

## 4) Exodus 2:16-25 **The Marriage of Moses**

His wife's name is Zipporah. They bear a son, whose name is Gershom, which means, "I have been a stranger in a strange land". It goes back to, "Not of this world".

Moses was in Egypt, but Egypt was no longer in Moses.
